Peer education is...



Led by young people but can be supported by adults.



Arranging a group session with other students to discuss an issue you have identified.



Talking to your friend(s) on your way home about something you have learnt.



Understanding that people learn in different ways.



Listening to the contributions of your peers, understanding how they feel and starting a conversation.



Thinking of new and exciting ways to engage young people in talking about key issues.



Peer education isn't...



Led by adults.



Assuming other young people already know and understand issues affecting other people and thinking nothing can be done.



Making your friends feel stupid that they don't know what you do.



Presenting information to others as your personal opinion without anything to back it up.



Something you can only do in school.



Where you have to pretend to be a teacher and shout at people who are not listening.
